

## **Guidelines for submission of BADP proposal for 2006-07 :-**

Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India has decided that henceforth, maximum emphasis would be given for the projects under BADP, in the areas closer to the international border. Accordingly, State Government has decided that for the BADP plan proposals of 2006-07, schemes / projects would be formulated in such a way that maximum benefits flow to the areas closer (say, within 10 Km.) to the international border.

2. It has been decided that 14 blocks (given below), that were taken up during 2004-05, would again be taken up during 2006-07 for the preparation of the projects under BADP. The outlay of Rs.1296.00 lakhs would mainly be allocated for these 14 blocks. Some funds may be allocated to complete the continuing projects and also to take up some special projects of urgent nature in other border blocks.

The Block Development Officer of each of the above mentioned 14 blocks, may prepare project proposals for the Grams / Gram Panchayats located in the international border, on the basis of available information of "**Gramoday**", if necessary. Major emphasis is to be given on improving infrastructure facilities like, roads, culvert & bridges, power supply, irrigation, minor irrigation, drinking water, school building, social education center, health facilities. etc. The BDO would then submit the consolidated block BADP plan, by integrating the **border** Gram/GP level action plans to the DM **by 20<sup>th</sup> January, 2005**, after getting it approved by the Panchayat Samithi / BAC.

4. In order to prepare a comprehensive area plan of the border Grams / GPs and also to avoid duplication of projects, it has been decided that the District Magistrate and Collector would co-ordinate total district BADP plan.

5. Tripura Tribal Areas Autonomous District Council (ADC) is requested to prepare **border** Gram level action plan and submit it, with the approved of the District Council, to the respective DM, with copy to the concerned Block and the Planning (P&C) department, by **15<sup>th</sup> January, 2005**.. Similarly, the

development department may prepare **border** Gram/GP level action plan and submit it, with the approval of the Department Minister, to the respective DM, with copy to the concerned Block and the Planning (P&C) department, by **15<sup>th</sup> January, 2005.**

**6.** All the project proposals under BADP for 2006-07, should, invariably, include the following information:

- (a) Brief description of the project.
- (b) The location (Mouza / Gram / GP) of the project.
- (c) The distance of it from the international border.
- (d) The justification of the project (in terms of gap in infrastructure}.
- (e) Whether the location of the project is within the TSP or SCP area.

It may be mentioned here that without the above information, the project proposal may not be approved by the SLSC. And the project proposal, located nearest to the border would be given maximum priority.

**7.** The DMs would submit the consolidated district BADP plan proposals to the Planning (P&C) department, positively, by **30<sup>th</sup> January, 2005.**

**8.** An attempt would be made by the Planning (P&C) department, to maintain the following overall sectoral distribution for BADP projects in 2006-07
